Naperville Writers Group Literary Series Continues **With Reading by Nina Corwin**

May 30th, 7 to 9 pm at Barnes and Noble in Bolingbrook

Naperville, IL – The Naperville Writers Group’s next literary evening will feature Nina Corwin. Corwin, a Chicago social worker is the author of a collection of poetry, *Conversations With Friendly Demons and Tainted Saints* (Puddin’head Press, 1999) and co-editor of *Inhabiting the Body: A Collection of Poetry and Art By Women* (Moon Journal Press, 2002). Host of the Molly Malone’s reading series, she has performed and given workshops across the country at venues that range from the Cantab Lounge in Cambridge, MA and Cornelia Street Cafe in NYC; to the Poetry Center at the Art Institute, University of Chicago and Harold Washington Library in Chicago, to Beyond Baroque in LA and the Albuquerque Poetry Festivals in the west. Her published work appears or is forthcoming in *ACM, Atlanta, Bayou, Spoon River, Nimrod, Poetry East, Cider Press and Southern Poetry Reviews*, as well as the anthologies *Visiting Frost* (University of Iowa Press, 2005) and *Poetic Voices Without Borders* (Gival Press). She has received awards from the Illinois Arts Council and the Illinois State Poetry Society.

In addition to Corwin, members of the Naperville Writers Group will read their prose and poetry, and time will be provided for members of the public to read during open mike.

The event will be held on Friday, May 30th, from 7 to 9 pm at the Barnes and Noble at the Promenade Center in Bolingbrook, 631 E Boughton Road. The public is invited and the event is free. If you would like to read, please arrive early and sign up.

Future Naperville Writers Group events will be held once a month at the Bolingbrook Barnes and Noble. These readings will feature Naperville Writers Group members and other local authors. Each evening will provide open mike time for members of the public to read.

Since its founding in 1987, the Naperville Writers Group has served scores of members of all ages. Members develop their writing skills through thoughtful, positive and useful critiques. Its members come from throughout Chicago's western suburbs and range from published, award-winning writers to those seeking an outlet for their interest.
