Naperville Writers Group Continues 2009 Literary Series With Readings by Esther Redelsheimer

March 27, 7 to 9 pm at Barnes and Noble in Bolingbrook

Naperville, IL – The Naperville Writers Group’s March literary evening will feature writer Esther Redelsheimer.

After giving a speech to her son’s Confirmation class and their parents, one of the mothers told Redelsheimer that she should send it in to their church magazine. It was both amazing and exciting that the editor accepted and published it and Redelsheimer has been writing ever since. She put together one book from her articles she wrote for her church newsletter, and her recent second book (over twenty years later) from articles she wrote mainly for the Naperville Writers Group’s publications of *Rivulets*. She has also published articles in *Lutheran Woman Today*, *The Chicago Tribune*, and in Dr. Bernie Siegel’s *How to Live Between Office Visits*. Redelsheimer will read from her book, *Life’s Best Gifts*, some inspirational, some family, some fun, all positive.

In addition to Redelsheimer, members of the Naperville Writers Group will read their prose and poetry, and time will be provided for members of the public to read during open mic.

The event will be held on Friday, March 27, from 7 to 9 pm at the Barnes and Noble at the Promenade Center in Bolingbrook, 631 E Boughton Road. The event is free and open to the public. If you would like to read, please arrive early and sign up.

Future Naperville Writers Group events will continue monthly at the Bolingbrook Barnes and Noble. These readings will feature Naperville Writers Group members and other local authors. Each evening will provide open mic time for members of the public to read.
